


Briefing & Tasking



The Briefing and Tasking Module allows officers to be automatically briefed with crimes that have occurred in their area and provides officers with intelligence they need to be aware of. It is an easily accessible module, available on both desktop and mobile devices, which targets briefings to certain officers based on skills and workplace. The module centralises information held in several systems, so officers get 'one view' of emerging incidents, initiatives, and tasks.

Features

- Allows officers to be briefed from a variety of sources such as crime and intelligence, command and control, and fleet management systems.
- The information informs officers on key elements such as people on a shift, resources booked to incidents, patrols, initiatives, urgent actions, missing persons, etc.
- Supervisors can see and direct officers to key tasks which impact on the community and ensure they are acted on.

- Community intelligence is provided such as community tensions, patrol hotspots, outstanding warrants, and priority intelligence.
- Briefing is specific to the officer or team ensuring officers are aware of key information, incidents, and community concerns. Briefings are revised during the shift, so as new information is available officers can be updated.

Benefits

- Officers get 'one view' of information and are kept up to date with live events so they can advise their communities and stay on top of emergent threats.
- The module includes an app, so officers do not need to return to base to get updates. It also means officers who are unfamiliar to the area can get up to speed quickly no matter where they are.
- Staff can update items in the brief which is then shared with everyone else so a level collaboration can be achieved that isn't currently possible.
- Supervisors using IR3 Operational and Briefing and Tasking modules can ensure compliance with key tasks and manage resources more effectively.
- This module significantly reduces the time of briefing meetings; sometimes eliminating them entirely.
